
What next?

- Try the Passoword Hacking game.






Colour Me In - Scene 1

Password Hacking Game

Information for teachers, parents and carers.



How to play:

NOTE: Keep your picture and password a secret in this game!

- 1. Both partners colour in 3 things from scene 2 in their own booklets. These 3 things are now their passwords.
- 2. Each partner takes it in turns to 'hack' the password by asking questions like "is it in the sky?" or "does it have fur?"
- 3. When a partner finds out the 3 objects, they get two chances to guess the correct order, e.g. "Is your password cloudballdog?"
- 4. Use scenes 3 and 4 to play again!

Note:

In the video Jack learns the importance of choosing a password that you can remember. He knows you shouldn't share your password with anyone except your Trusted Adult.

You can reinforce this message and help your child test their memory. To do this, you simply take the password drawing they have created, and at a later time that day, or the next day, ask them to repeat their password.




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




Colour Me In - Scene 2






